Study Guide Group Questions: John 11:1-57

1) Why didn't Jesus return immediately to Bethany upon hearing that Lazarus was sick? Instead, He waited two more days before going to see him (see verses 5-7).

2) What did Jesus mean when He told His disciples, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep; but I'm going there to wake him up (see verse 11)?"

3)	John gives us the detail that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days. Why do you think this detail was important enough to add (see verse 17)?
4)	Why were the disciples fearful of Jesus agreeing to accept Martha and Mary's request to go and visit them in Bethany (see verses 18-20)?
5)	When Martha and Mary encounter Jesus after the death of Lazarus, what differences or similarities do you see in their response to Jesus' arrival (see verses 21-32)?

6)	How can we come to understand from this passage that Jesus can and does relate to all of the trials and tribulations that we carry with us in this world?
	Why did Jesus awaken Lazarus from his sleep (raise him from the dead)? Was this an important miracle? If so, why and what indications are there to tell us that it was an important miracle?
